


Home Warranties for Albertans

Background and Intention of NHBPA

- MA identified homes experiencing serious, costly problems with building envelope.
 - Across Alberta, all types of homes.

NHBPA:

- Enhance the standard of building in Alberta.
- Improve consumer protection and recourse options.




Relevant Legislation

New Home Buyer Protection Act

- √ Came into force February 1, 2014
- ✓ New Home Buyer Protection General Regulation
- ✓ New Home Buyer Protection Ministerial Regulation
- ✓ Amendment to Permit Regulation (SCA)

Insurance Act

- ✓ Warranty contracts are contracts of insurance governed by the Insurance Act.
- Dispute resolution process will flow out of the Insurance Act and regulations.
- √ Home Warranty Insurance Regulation




Required Coverage

- Mandatory Minimum Coverage:
 - √ 1 year on labour and materials,
 - 2 years for defects in labour and materials related to delivery and distribution systems,
 - √ 5 years on building envelope, with requirement to offer additional 2 years, and
 - √ 10 years on major structural components.



New Home Buyer Protection Act


- Applies to all new residential construction built under a permit applied for after the Act comes into force.
- Includes houses, condominiums, recreational properties (cottages and cabins), and modular and manufactured homes.
- Includes major reconstruction, based on percentage of rebuilt square footage.



Application of the NHBPA


Does not apply to:

- hotels, motels, dormitories, care facilities, relocatable work camps, Habitat for Humanity, the Alberta Social Housing Corporation
- detached amenity buildings, parking garages, recreation facilities and swimming pools.
- If unclear consider ABC definition of dwelling unit:
 - Dwelling unit means a suite operated as a housekeeping unit, used or intended to be used by one or more persons and usually containing cooking, eating, living, sleeping and sanitary facilities.



Owner Builders

- May build with warranty
- Apply for an Authorization to build without warranty.
 - Must be building their own home and intend to live in it for 10 years.
 - √ Can only apply once every 3 years.
 - ✓ Applicants must be on title
- If an Authorization is in place, the home may not be sold without warranty for 10-years.
- Processing time 10-14 days.



Role of NHBPO

- Support to builders, warranty providers, homeowners and permit issuers.
 - Legislative interpretation
 - System and administrative support
 - Public Education
- Process registrations and authorizations efficiently to support permit process.
- Compliance officers do not duplicate role of SCO.


Role of Builders and Warranty Providers

- Obtain and offer warranty coverage meeting the minimum requirements of the NHBPA.
- Enter all new residential construction into the Public Registry of the NHBPS.
- Ensure that the data in the Public Registry is accurate and up-to-date.
- Provide proof of warranty coverage to permit issuers.
- Warranty providers use the NHBPS to validate builders and confirm warranty coverage




Role of Permit Issuers

- Issue building permits for new home construction when warranty or exemption/authorization is in place
- Addressing confirmation.
- Information regarding type of development.
- De-enrollment support.




Construction Activity

- Over 41,000 units registered in the system February 2014 to mid March 2015.
- 900+ Owner Builder Authorizations
- 32,000 registered from February 1 -December 31, 2014.
 - Consistent with housing start predictions.



Construction Activity

- Small and large builders are doing business in Alberta and have registered projects in NHBPS.
- 3000 builders and owner builders with and without warranty.
 - 1500 were builders of 1-5 single family homes,
 900 were outside the urban centres (Feb-Dec).
 - 209 builders registered 6-10 units in NHBPS.
- 7 warranty providers in Alberta, (4 pre-2014).






Construction Performance Guide

- Developed with representatives from government, home warranty and construction industry.
- Standardized catalog of defects to be used by all warranty providers and builders.
 - Defect description, acceptable performance, applicable coverage, expected action, et al.



Goals of the Guide

- Catalog issues homeowners might discover throughout the life of their home.
- Explain how homeowners can expect a particular issue to be acted on under the New Home Buyer Protection Act and its regulations.
- Not mean't to be comprehensive or exclusive




